CGIS Schedule for August 17th to August 28th

CGIS Traditional Learners will attend school Monday through Friday on campus during the normal school times.

- We will not have a staggered schedule to begin the school day.
- Students cannot be dropped off at the Hilltop side of the building or in the front parking lot.
- Temperature Checks will still be administered for every student prior to entering the building.
- The word of the week is patience. While we are reintroducing the entire traditional learning student body back to a regular schedule, patience with this process will be greatly appreciated.

MCS DIGITAL LEARNERS: NO CHANGE - Continue to follow all attendance and academic requirements set by your teacher. Remember to follow your daily schedule and let your teacher know if you are going to be absent from class.

Wondering about RTI Services and how this works during a pandemic?

Multiple times per year, each student at Coulter Grove Intermediate School is given a universal screening assessment to determine his or her reading abilities. We also look at overall math and writing abilities as well as characteristics of dyslexia. When students demonstrate a possible need for intervention they are given follow up measures to determine the specific skill deficit. Then, students who need intervention are provided with additional intervention during their day to focus on skills related to reading, math, and writing deficits. This extra intervention is provided by Response to Intervention (RTI) teachers through general education. Parents of students who score below the cutoff on screening and progress monitoring measures will be notified by one of Coulter Grove's RTI teachers. If you have <u>not</u> been notified by one of Coulter Grove's RTI teachers you can assume your child was not recommended for RTI.

Per state recommendations, it is not advised to give the Universal Screener immediately so this did not occur as normal this year. We are working through this process to support all students and prepare for a reliable assessment period. Due to the pandemic, the state has suggested giving students time to participate in some form of learning recovery. It is 'normal' if your student is demonstrating some loss of academic skills from March of last school year to present day. Again, you will be notified if your child is recommended for RTI once screenings and progress monitoring measures resume.

7th Grade Immunization Reminder - All 7th Grade students must have their updated immunization form submitted to the clinic by September 8th.

The Rebel Run 10K, 5K, and 1 Mile Run/Walk is in its 9th year. The event will look different this year due to COVID 19 and for the safety of our participants, staff, volunteers, and spectators. The event will be a combination in person and virtual event. The 10K and 5K events are planned for in person with a limited number of registrants for each event. At this time, the cap is 250 per event on a first come, first serve basis. Racers will register for a 15 minute time slot to start the race. The 10K rolling start will begin at 6:30 AM and end at 7:30 AM. The 5K rolling start begins at 8:00 AM and ends at 9:00 AM. Anyone may register to run the 10K, 5K, and 1 mile as a virtual race through noon on August 22. The 1 Mile Run/Walk will only be a virtual event due to the safety of children and families. Shirts guaranteed to all registrants through August 12 at noon.

DATE/TIME/PLACE: Saturday, August 22, Maryville High School, 833 Lawrence Avenue, Maryville, TN 37803; NO EVENT DAY REGISTRATION; ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST REGISTER IN ADVANCE; NO SPECTATORS ALLOWED AT THE START LINE OR IN THE STADIUM

COURSE DESCRIPTION: The 10K and 5K courses are USATF certified. Both the 10K and 5K are single loop courses with some rolling hills and fast flats, traveling on area roads, greenway, and sidewalks.

- The <u>10K in person</u> rolling start begins at 6:30 AM and ends at 7:30 AM. Sign up for a start time during registration. Chip time only, limited to 250 participants
- The <u>10K virtual option</u> is also available, meaning you do it on your own from August 15-22 anywhere safe and convenient for you!
- The <u>5K in person</u> rolling start begins at 8:00 AM and ends at 9:00 AM. Sign up for a start time during registration. Chip time only, limited to 250 participants
- The <u>5K virtual option</u> is also available, meaning you will do it on your own from August 15 22 anywhere safe and convenient for you!
- The 1 Mile Fun Run/Walk will be virtual only. You may run a one mile designated course (to be announced) on race day or enjoy a walk/run anywhere safe and convenient for you!

For Virtual Participants: We will be doing one give-away per day for virtual participants from August 15 -22. Just post your run on social media along with a picture of anything related to your run including the location, results on your Garmin, Strava, etc. Tag your post with Maryville City Schools Foundation and Be Aware Blount and include the hashtag #MCSFRebelRun. Don't have social media? No problem, just email a picture from your run to mcsf@maryville-schools.org. MCSF will select a random winner each day for a gift card.

Note: Most roads are not closed, but we will have course monitors to try and halt traffic for runners. Runners should be aware that vehicles COULD be on the course. *RUNNERS ONLY ALLOWED ON THE 10K COURSE.*

REGISTRATION: Online registration is available through noon Friday, August 21 for all in person events. Virtual registrations are accepted through Noon on Saturday, August 22. **Guaranteed shirt cut-off is August 12 at noon!** Shirts and bibs must be picked up in advance of the race. **NO EVENT DAY REGISTRATION or BIB PICK UP.**

Protecting Staff and Children During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Students should be kept home from school for the following reasons:

Positive COVID-19 test

OR

Symptoms of COVID-19

OR

Close contact with someone highly suspected or confirmed positive for COVID-19

GENERAL COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

- Fever (temperature 100.4 °F or greater) or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- **Fatigue**
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache

New loss of taste or smell

- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Students out for COVID-related reasons will become digital learners and not be counted absent if educational engagement continues.

- Notify your child's school
- Isolate the child at home for 10 days from the onset of symptoms or 10 days from test if asymptomatic
- Must be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to school
- Child must check-in with school nurse upon returning to school
- Notify your child's school
- Consult your healthcare provider
- Isolate the child at home for 10 days from the onset of symptoms
- The period of isolation can be reduced by doing one of the following:
 - Confirmation from a healthcare provider of an alternate explanation for the symptoms; or
 - Child has been well for at least 72 hours and has documentation of two negative COVID-19 molecular/PCR tests at least 24 hours apart
- Child must check-in with school nurse upon returning to school
- Notify your child's school
- Quarantine your child for 14 days from the last contact with the suspected or confirmed individual
- If symptoms occur, then follow the action steps above for COVID-like symptoms
- Tennessee Department of Health only recommends testing if symptomatic
- The 14-day quarantine period cannot be reduced by a negative test
- * Close contact is considered being within 6 ft. of a person for 10 minutes or more.

Children with second-hand exposure (i.e., exposure to someone who has been in contact with a positive case) may continue to attend school.
