Digital Citizenship - Information Literacy 5/3/19

Here are a few words of wisdom regarding digital citizenship. This week, we are focusing on Information Literacy. Using strategies to search for information online can save you a lot of time. Too often, people use broad search keywords that lead to pages of millions of results. Getting through these search results to find the most relevant information can waste time. At Maryville City Schools, we recommend that each person: Take a few seconds to think about how you'll search for information. Use quotations around a phrase if you want to find that exact phrase. Using the minus sign allows you to omit certain terms from your search. Ask a teacher about other strategies for searching the internet efficiently.

Current 5th and 6th Graders - CGIS Student Leadership Team

The Application process for Rangers, Ranger Captains, and Nest Egg workers will be open soon! These are student leadership positions at our school and will qualify you to be a part of the excellent CGIS Student Leadership Team. Being part of the CGIS Student Leadership Team will qualify you to help lead and shape the future of our school and be eligible for the Leadership trip to New York City in May, 2020.

To be a Ranger: Complete the application, point sheet write an essay, PowerPoint, or create a leadership poster, and have been an excellent example of a leader through your actions and attitudes this year. No Altitude Adjustments, ISS, OSS, or major office referrals.

To be a Ranger Captain: Must be a current Ranger, complete the Ranger Application and Point Sheet.

To work at the Nest Egg: Complete the application and point sheet, and have been an excellent example of a leader through your actions and attitudes this year. No Altitude Adjustments, ISS, OSS, or major office referrals. The top applicants will go through an interview process with CBBC bank personnel. Only 4, 6th graders and 4, 7th graders will be chosen.

(Other areas included in Student Leadership are: Liaisons, Student Council, Bookstore Workers, and Hawk Helper LEADERS - Chosen from Hawk Helpers for certain jobs)

Nest Egg Applications will need to be picked up by qualified students from Mrs. Taylor on April 26, 2019 and are due May 3rd. Interviews for top applicants will take place May 14, from 3-4:00. No late or incomplete applications will be accepted. Completed applications should be turned into Mrs. Taylor.

Ranger and Ranger Captain Applications will need to be picked up (and turned in) from Mrs. Taylor, Mr. Riddle, Ms. Borstelmann, or Mr. Harveston starting April 29, 2019. Application, point sheet, essay or poster is due by May 14, 2019. No late or incomplete applications will be accepted.

If the student is applying for more than one position only 1 point sheet needs to be filled out for all of them.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL RISING 7th GRADE STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

All students entering 7th Grade are required to have the following immunizations PRIOR to Tuesday, August 6, 2019.

- · Tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis booster (T-dap)
- · Verification of immunity to Varicella (chicken pox): 2 doses or history of disease with documentation

In order for your student to start school at CGIS on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 6</u>, <u>2019</u>, an updated immunization record printed on the NEW OFFICIAL "Tennessee Department of Health Certificate" of immunization form must be provided to the school.

***Please use these next few months to get your student's shots updated and printed on the paper form. ***If there is a religious exception for your student's immunizations, please stop by our school clinic to sign a "Religious Exemption" form.

Moving?

Are you moving outside the City of Maryville, and your student is transferring schools? You will need to come by Student Services to withdraw your student. Your student will be checked out through the library, cafeteria, and classrooms. They will also return all technology equipment and any school-owned musical instrument. Please call ahead to Student Services, 982-6346, so we can get everything ready for you.

Are you staying in the city but moving outside Coulter Grove's zone?

This will save you time and give you the necessary paperwork for enrollment at the new school.

You will need to come by Student Services to withdraw your student, so we can prepare for the transfer to Montgomery Ridge. As with all moves inside the city, proof of residence for your new address will need to be provided for the transfer. If you have extenuating circumstances and would prefer to remain at Coulter Grove, you will need to complete a Zone Transfer request. These are available in the Student Services Office and are subject to approval by MCS Central Office.

Are you moving, but will still be inside the city and zoned for Coulter Grove?

You will need to provide the required documents verifying your address, so updates can be made to our student database. Proof of Residence Requirements are below.

Proof of Residence Requirements:

If a custodial parent or legal guardian is renting or owns a residence inside the city limits, then proof of residence will be established by providing the following 2 documents: (1) rental or mortgage contract and (2) a current utility bill such as telephone, electric, water or cable. Each item must have your name, current date, and address.

Or, if the parent/legal guardian is residing with a resident of Maryville City, then the owner/resident of the property will be required to provide a notarized affidavit to that effect, and provide the information listed above to establish residency. This affidavit form can be obtained in the school office. In addition, the parent/guardian must provide at least four (4) of the following documents, each containing the parent/guardian name, address, and current date: (1) Current bank statements, (2) Employer letter verifying residence (3) Pay check, work stub or government benefits (4) Auto, life or health insurance policy (5) Driver's license (6) TN motor vehicle registration or title (7) TN voter registration (8) IRS tax reporting forms within last 12 months (9) Receipt for personal property or real property taxes paid within last 12 months.
