Here are a few words of wisdom regarding digital citizenship. This week, we are focusing on Cyberbullying & Digital Drama. We hear a lot about morals. Have you ever thought about what it means to have morals? To be a moral person, you have to be able to tell the difference between right and wrong. Most of us know what is right and wrong. We know it's wrong to deliberately hurt others, online or in person, but when others are involved in digital drama, it can be tempting to join in. At Maryville City Schools, we recommend that each person: Reflect on a time you did the right thing, even when it was difficult. Doing the right thing can be difficult.
